From the Oscar Curtas Boomerang Foundation

Our deepest condolences to his family and to the entire boomerang world.

We lost a patriarch, the patriarch of our modern boomerang sport.

BENJAMIN RUHE, a fundamental force and pillar behind the promotion and creation of the modern boomerang sport and the man who started it all in the US.

Ben played a pivotal role in the development of the modern boomerang sport and its promotion in the USA and beyond.

The talks, events like The Smithsonian Boomerang Tournament and newsletters he initiated at the Smithsonian National Air and Space Museum woke up the dormant interest in the boomerang sport throughout the US and its ripple effects gave birth to the World Championships and what we all know today as Modern Boomerang Competition Sport.

His first book "Many Happy Returns" published in 1977 and his Smithsonian newsletters turned into the USBA "Many Happy Returns" newsletter when he, Mrs. Ali Fujino and others started the USBA (United States Boomerang Association) in 1981 and he is the person behind one of the most iconic greetings of the boomerang world: Many happy returns!!!

Ben collection of books, research papers, films, boomerangs etc on the subject of boomerangs is the primary research source for boomerangs research in the United States.

He was the Captain of the first US Boomerang team that participated in the US vs Australia Challenge celebrated in Melbourne in November of 1981. The international cup of 1981 was the first time the famous Uncle Toby Oats Boomerang trophy was awarded and the cups of 1981 and 1984 were the first world boomerang cups and the precursors of the IFBA - International Federation of Boomerang Associations WBC's (World Boomerang Championships).

Along with his creative and highly artistic family, that includes Barnaby Ruhe, Richard Ruhe, Peter and Larry Ruhf; Ben and family were creators and contributors to many of the games that we all play in the modern boomerang competitions.

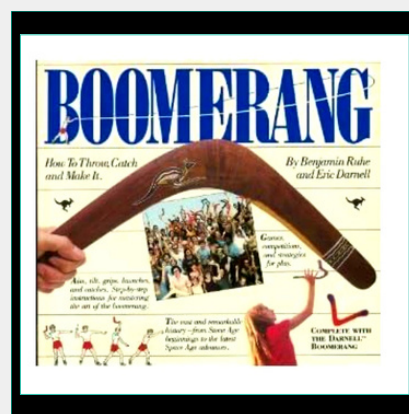
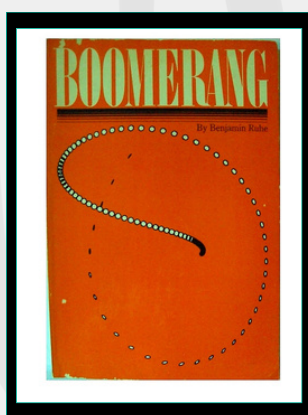

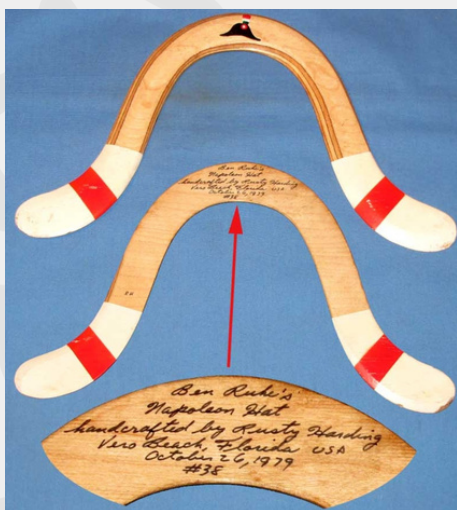
Ben Ruhe's books include:

We do know because of the correspondence from the 70's between Ben Ruhe and Oscar Cuartas, that we have in the OCBF archives, plus a conversation with one of Oscar pupils, Juan Eduardo Villegas and Oscar's wife that Oscar starting point to create in the late 70's his signature model, the Parrot, that won the 1st Aesthetics Awards of 1984, was indeed Ben Ruhe's Omega plus the shape of the family Parrot favourite wooden branch.

It's a collection of high-resolution photos of boomerangs that influenced (and continue to influence) the direction of boomerangs over the last 100 or so years.

256 pages, hard cover w/dust jacket,

Each has an accompanying essay to explain its selection, along with supporting images, many of which have never been published. Many boomerangs will be familiar, but perhaps not in the level of detail one might typically expect. Some will be seen for the first time.

The project has been active in its present form for about 12 years but, as a concept, probably twice as long. Many emails, other correspondences and interviews contributed, and I'm truly grateful for the help from the boomerang community.

You will also find rules for our competition, events and throwing field, including throw stick. It even includes warm up and stretches to avoid injury.

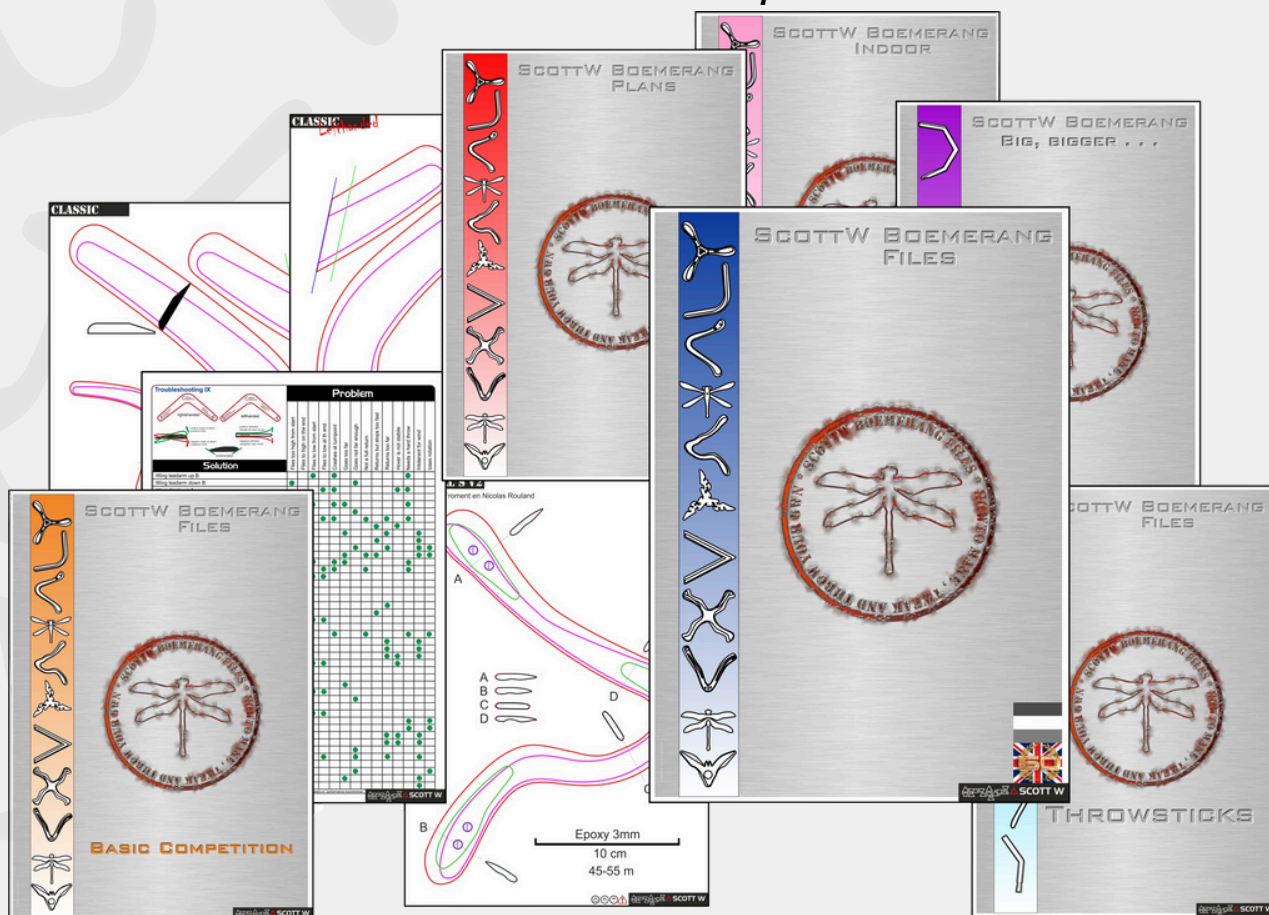
A few other topics are:

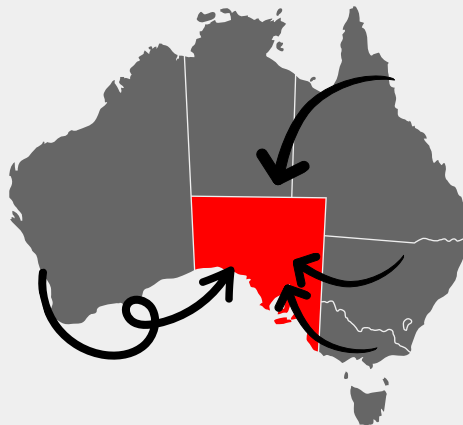

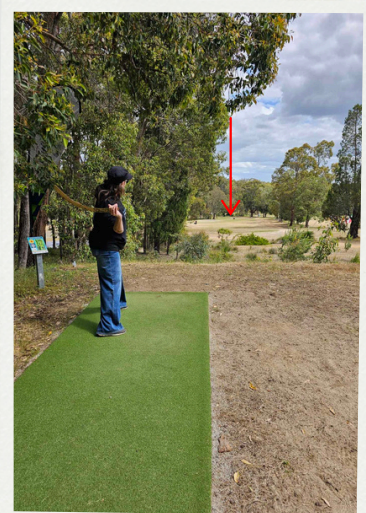
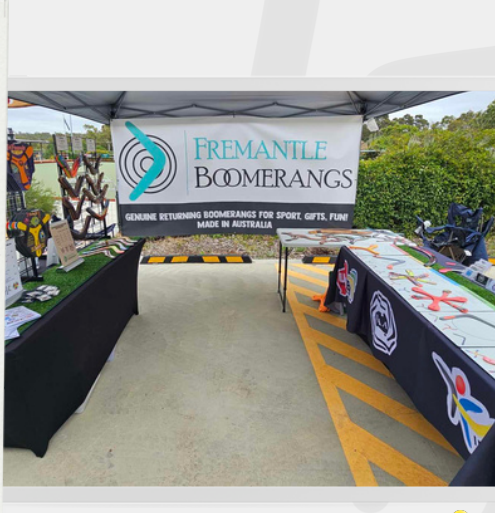

INDIVIDUAL EVENT WORLD RECORDS

- 2 ROUNDS / 5 THROWS** each, qualifying distance 30 metres, based on return landing. Maximum 100 points. (Felix from Germany) 99 points
- 3 ROUNDS / 5 THROWS** each, points for distance accuracy of return - Maximum 100 points. (99 points)
- 4 ROUNDS / 5 THROWS** each, throw and catch 5 throws in less than 18 minutes. Qualifying distance 20 metres. (Manuel Schütz, Switzerland) 14.07 seconds
- 5 ROUNDS / 5 THROWS** (throw only), longest time to catch 5 throws (over level catch). (Aly, best catch.) 2nd round, perform various catches. (Aly) 14.07 seconds
- DISTANCE** - throw as far as you can and then try to return over from throwing position. (Manuel Schütz, Switzerland) 238 metres
- NO STOP** - throw and catch continuously. (122 hours, 41 minutes)

1 ROUNDS / 5 THROWS (per round, max total points 100). Distance, Accuracy and Catch. 6 points for 30 metres or more range and 49 metres range. 2 points for accuracy (as played above). Throw from the centre 2 metre circle to achieve max point per throw: 4 pts catch, 4 pts throw = 20 points. Event for 5 minutes. When time is up, yes and return from the centre 2 metre circle.

INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF BOOMERANG ASSOCIATIONS (IFBA)

The International Federation of Boomerang Associations (IFBA) is the governing body for the sport of boomerang throwing. It was founded in 1987 and has over 100 member associations worldwide. The IFBA organizes the World Boomerang Championships and other international events. It also promotes the sport and provides resources for members and the public.
